
Dear current or former federal workers,

The skills you have developed up to this point can absolutely bring you to your next role -- one that grows and develops your skills but also allows you to make an impact by extending your public service through organizations in other parts of the economy.

The goal of this playbook is to give you specific suggestions for great next job roles that leverage your government experience. You'll do this by asking tailored questions (or "prompts") to a free AI assistant like ChatGPT, Claude or any other one you prefer.

This playbook is designed for both newbies and AI pros. Never used an AI tool before? Don't worry! We'll guide you through every step of the process to help you discover:

- 1. What specific skills make you attractive to non-federal employers
- 2. How to translate those skills to a future employer in a compelling narrative
- 3. Which job titles/roles might be a great fit based on your experience and preferences
- 4. What upskilling opportunities could make you even more competitive

First things first—your public service is incredibly valuable, and the skills you've developed in government are in high demand. You just need to know how to showcase them in the right way!

This playbook is designed to help you discover how your federal experience translates to exciting opportunities outside the federal government. Whether you've never used AI tools before or you're already familiar with them, we'll walk you through this process step by step.

What you'll get from this playbook:

- Discover which of your specific skills are most attractive to non-federal employers
- Translate those skills to a future employer in a compelling narrative
- Identify job titles and roles that match your experience and preferences
- Learn where you might want to upskill to become even more competitive

Getting Started with AI Tools

What's an AI Chatbot?

Think of an AI chatbot like a smart assistant that can help analyze your skills and experience, then suggest career paths based on that information. Tools like ChatGPT, Claude, or other AI chatbots are free to use and incredibly helpful for this process.

What's a "Prompt"?

A prompt is simply the question or instruction you give to the AI chatbot. Think of it as starting a conversation—you're telling the AI what you want to know, and it responds with helpful information.



How to Use This Playbook:

- 1. **Using this worksheet**, draft your responses to the prompts where you see [brackets]
- 2. **Open an AI tool** in your browser (like <u>ChatGPT</u>, <u>Claude</u>, or another AI chatbot)
- 3. **Copy and paste** each prompt, moving through each of the steps
- 4. Click submit and review the AI's personalized response
- 5. **Continue** with the next prompt to dig deeper!

PRO TIP: Don't be afraid to go back and try different prompts or add more information if you think of something later. This is an exploration, not a test—there are no wrong answers!



Step 1: Translate Your Federal Experience into Non-Federal Sector Roles

In this first step, you will identify your transferable skills and discover roles in for-profit, non-profit, and/or academia that might be a great fit.

PRO TIP: Don't hold back - The more details you share about your achievements, the better recommendations you'll get. This is your chance to shine - those bullet points from your resume are perfect, or just jot down 3-5 new ones that showcase your accomplishments.

For your "Special Skills," think about specific technical abilities you've developed like digital literacy, data analysis, policy development, or mediation skills. Used any cool tools or software? These details help the AI find roles where your specific expertise is valued.

When listing "Soft Skills," remember these are your secret weapon when changing sectors! These transferable abilities often matter more than technical skills. Check out a list of soft skills following the prompt template below:

PROMPT 1: Translate Your Federal Experience into Non-Federal Sector Roles

Step 2: Refine Role Alignment Based on Your Specific Career Goals

Now let's narrow down those options based on what you really want in your next career move.

PRO TIP: This is your chance to paint a picture of your ideal work environment! Think beyond just job titles to what would make you excited to go to work. Mission driven? Be clear that is a priority. Location matters? Mention it. Dream of working remotely? Say so. Passionate about housing policy or cybersecurity? Note it here.

If you have a long-term career goal or job, sharing it helps the AI suggest roles that put you on that path. Don't have a specific long-term vision? That's completely fine too - many successful careers evolve organically.

Don't hesitate to mention your deal-breakers. If certain job characteristics would make you miserable, it's smart to rule them out now. Being upfront about these boundaries saves time and helps find truly suitable matches.

PROMPT 2: Refine Role Alignment Based on Your Specific Career Goals

Based on the roles you suggested, I want to further refine my options.

Step 3: Build a Resume That Highlights Your Strengths

While government resumes often focus on processes and responsibilities, non-federal employers care more about outcomes and impact, especially those that can be quantified. Did you save money? Improve efficiency? Solve a complex problem? Research a novel area and further collective understanding? These results-oriented achievements will make your resume shine.

Look back at those job titles the AI suggested earlier - did any spark your interest? Add those here! If you have other roles in mind that weren't mentioned, include those too.

PROMPT 3: Build A Resume That Highlights Your Strengths

You've navigated complex processes, managed multiple stakeholders with conflicting interests, and operated within structured environments while still finding ways to innovate. These skills are incredibly valuable to companies dealing with regulations, government contracts, or complex organizational challenges.
